Welcome. I am excited to host you. Czechs are famous for their 'pohostinnost' (hospitality), but before heading out to enjoy all that Prague has to offer, here are tips to help you live like a local and be a good neighbour while you're in town.

FOLLOW THE HOUSE RULES



Please be respectful of my space, common areas and follow the local ways. Rubbish has to be separated - ask me where to find our dustbins (blue stands for paper, yellow for plastics, white for transparent glass, green for coloured glass, and black for general waste). Do not litter or smoke in the common space. If you happen to meet our neighbours, feel free to say 'dobrý den' (hello).



RESPECT THE CITY

Do not hesitate to ask me about local customs, like how to use public transport including the must-ride Petrín funicular, and respect the rhythm of the city. Be conscious of the noise rolling and wheeled suitcases make on our old cobbled streets.


